## **O2** Challenge 2.3 Funds for businesses



#### **CHALLENGE OVERVIEW**

- Problem outline
  - There are many funds or fiscal measures already in place that stimulate businesses to invest in occupational safety and health
    - → BUT lack of awareness and knowledge about available measures
- Goal
  - Guide businesses to those funds or fiscal measures
  - Develop an up-to-date overview of funding possibilities for businesses



- Desk research complex exercise & lack of resources
- Questionnaire
  - How can businesses best be assisted in tackling carcinogens at the workplace?
  - What are the specific funding tools, information guides, technical advise programmes, sectoral incentives etc. that are needed at the sectoral/national level?
  - How can businesses be assisted in the most effective way in making use of these available tools or funds?
  - How do you, as a (cross-)sectoral member federation, already assist businesses in finding existing funding tools?
  - Are you aware of existing financial instruments/funds available in your country for businesses to support them in managing carcinogens-related risks at the workplace? Could you please provide us with info or guide us to it?
  - Are you aware of any websites, publications, organisations or contact persons where businesses can find or be informed on an overview of such existing tools/funds available?



- Target audience
  - National employers' organisations, European sectoral employers' organisations, individual companies, national focal points.
- Timeline
  - First round: early 2021
  - Second round: end 2021 early 2022
  - Third round: early 2023
  - Fourth round: end 2023

- → No response rate
- → Limited response rate
- → Improved response rate
- → Stagnant response rate



#### MAIN CONCLUSIONS

- Despite wide consultation of several stakeholders via different ways and at different times
  - → a clear lack of results BUT the fact that this is so difficult is also a result!
- Possibilities to make greater impact within RoC3.0 are to be explored
- Alternative ways to complete the challenge in a sustainable and effective way are still to be explored in RoC3.0
  - such as a web page or report with current funding possibilities



## O3 Challenge 3.1 Engaging industry & sectors



#### **CHALLENGE OVERVIEW**

- Problem outline
  - Despite interest in the issue, many employers face high barriers in becoming more engaged in tackling carcinogens in the workplace
  - Scattered good practices and lack of awareness raising hinder an efficient approach
- Goal
  - Mobilise and engage cross-industry and sectoral organisations to join the Roadmap and its activities
  - Activate sectors to develop their own solutions and feed into the Roadmap with practical implementation tips
  - Involving these organisations in RoC2.0 is the first step to find ways for collaboration and future projects



- Developed a <u>scene-setting article</u>
  - Published on the Roadmap website on 25 April 2022
  - Widely disseminated amongst various networks
  - Dual objective:
    - retrospective on the outcome of the May 2019 conference on "The role of sectoral organisations with respect to preventing exposure to carcinogens"
    - Introduction to the online workshop on "Roadmap on Carcinogens
      - Engaging sectors and industry" of 19 May 2022



- Organised an online workshop on "Roadmap on Carcinogens Engaging sectors and industry" (19 May 2022)
  - Dual objective:
    - Look into the important role of (cross-)sectoral organisations in supporting and encouraging the companies in their network to take measures against exposure to carcinogens.
    - Find out to what extent sectoral organisations can work together with the Roadmap on Carcinogens and formulating follow-up actions for the coming years.
  - Sharing of knowledge and good practices about two key areas:
    - > Safe working procedures (in line with Challenge 4.3)
    - Financing of measures to prevent workers getting exposed to carcinogens (in line with Challenge 2.3)
  - No specific follow-up actions were agreed upon



- RoC recurring item on the agenda of the BusinessEurope Health and Safety Working Group
  - WG is made up out of national cross-industry federations as well as European sectoral employers' organisations
  - Stock-taking exercise of successful activities from industries and sectos
  - Members are invited to all RoC-related activities
  - Members have been speakers at events organised by RoC partners



#### MAIN CONCLUSIONS

- Roadmap actions and initiatives continuously well-received by stakeholders
- Very positive attitude towards renewal of RoC 3.0
- Nevertheless, need for more input from the industries and sectors already involved as well as wider engagement
